I respectfully submit this Declaration in support of Plaintiffs' Motion for Preliminary 17 Approval of Class Action Settlement. The following is based on my personal knowledge, and if 18 called upon to do so, I could and would competently testify thereto. 19 2. I am executive Director of the Positive Women's Network - United States of America 20 ("PWN-USA"). 21 3. Founded in 2008, PWN-USA is a national membership body of women living with 22 HIV and our allies that exists to strengthen the strategic power of women living with HIV in the 23 U.S. 24 4. The HIV pandemic (globally and domestically) has been propelled by racism, 25 poverty, misogyny and stigma. Destigmatizing HIV and destigmatizing the communities most 26 impacted by HIV underlies all aspects of PWN-USA's policy agenda. 27 5. PWN-USA has developed a policy agenda grounded in social justice and human 28 rights.

- 6. Our policy priorities are strategically chosen to fill gaps that we perceive in the landscape, including places we perceive opportunities to uplift the voices of people living with HIV.
- 7. Our approach to policy advocacy centers the leadership and voices of communities that are directly and disproportionately impacted.
- 8. Our members shape policy at the state and federal level, fighting stigma and discrimination, and calling for full rights and dignity for all people living with, and vulnerable to, HIV.
- 9. PWN-USA members have served on key advisory and decision-making bodies that include the Presidential Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS, the CDC/HRSA Advisory Committee (CHAC), and numerous statewide and regional planning bodies.
- 10. PWN-USA leads local, state, and federal advocacy and community organizing efforts on a range of human rights and social justice issues important to our members and aligned with our policy agenda.
- 11. PWN-USA works in alignment with movement partners. We are proud to serve as an active member of the Act Now End AIDS Coalition, the AIDS United Public Policy Committee, the Black United Leadership Institute, the Health Not Prisons Collective, HIV Justice Worldwide, HIV Racial Justice Now, the Radical Communicators Network, and the U.S. People Living with HIV Caucus.
